Building Our Future: Service Partner Enrichment Programs

At Plymouth Place, education is more than a promise—it's a pathway. Our commitment goes beyond scholarships, extending to resident-led English as a Second Language (ESL) tutoring, a scholarship committee, and our in-house Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) Academy. Each initiative helps employees build skills, advance careers, and deliver exceptional care.

“When we invest in education and development, we’re building a foundation for compassionate, skilled, and confident caregivers,” said MaryCon Tate, Program Coordinator.



Launched in December 2023, our CNA Academy has already produced **27 graduates**. This homegrown talent reduces reliance on agency staffing and ensures consistent care for residents. Recognized nationally by **McKnight's and Provider magazines**, the program is a model of innovation in workforce development.

For many, the CNA Academy has been life-changing. **“Plymouth invested in my future, and the support from my mentors was amazing. I truly love my job,”** shared graduate Stella Ehumah.

Through initiatives like the CNA Academy, we are not just advancing careers but are ensuring a strong, sustainable future for our community.

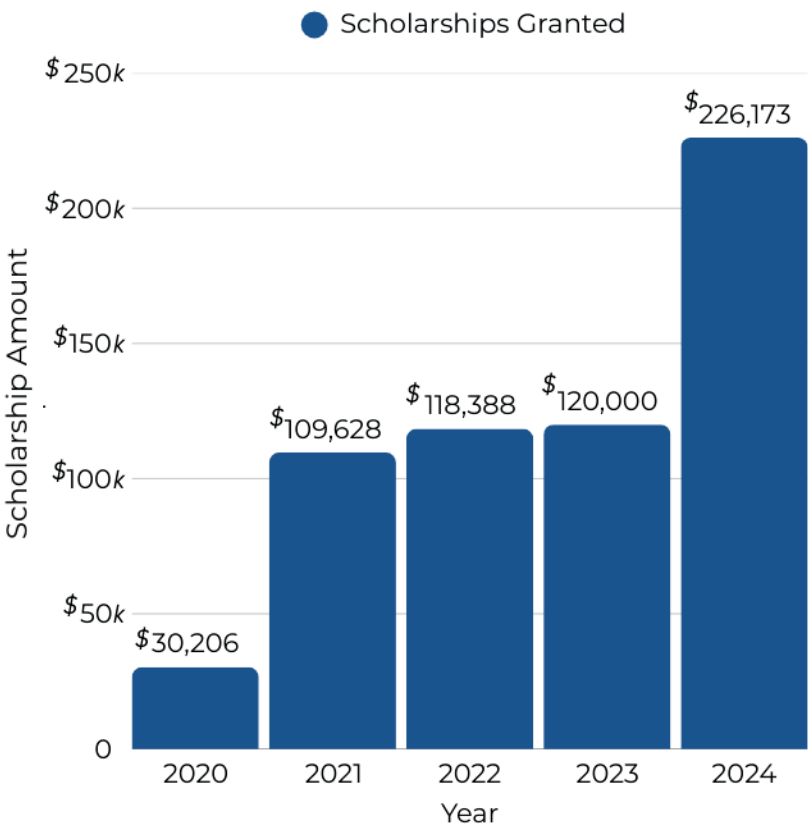

As innovators in aging well, Plymouth Place continues to lead with care solutions that make a real difference. In 2022, **we partnered with six other senior living communities to establish a recruitment office in Manila, Philippines**, responding to the growing demand for talent.



This program attracts highly qualified nurses with bachelor's degrees or higher and supports their success by providing housing, transportation, and scholarships. Working alongside residents, they bring **skill, compassion, and cultural richness** to our community. Exceptional nurses and dedicated team members are vital to our mission, ensuring the safety and well-being of everyone we serve. This program has created many success stories, helping nurses move from modest incomes to rewarding careers while also providing for their families overseas.

"It's truly a win-win," said Siân Stevens, Executive Director of Plymouth Place, who plans to expand the program to include CNAs from Ghana. "These individuals enrich the lives of residents while we positively impact theirs. It's truly remarkable."

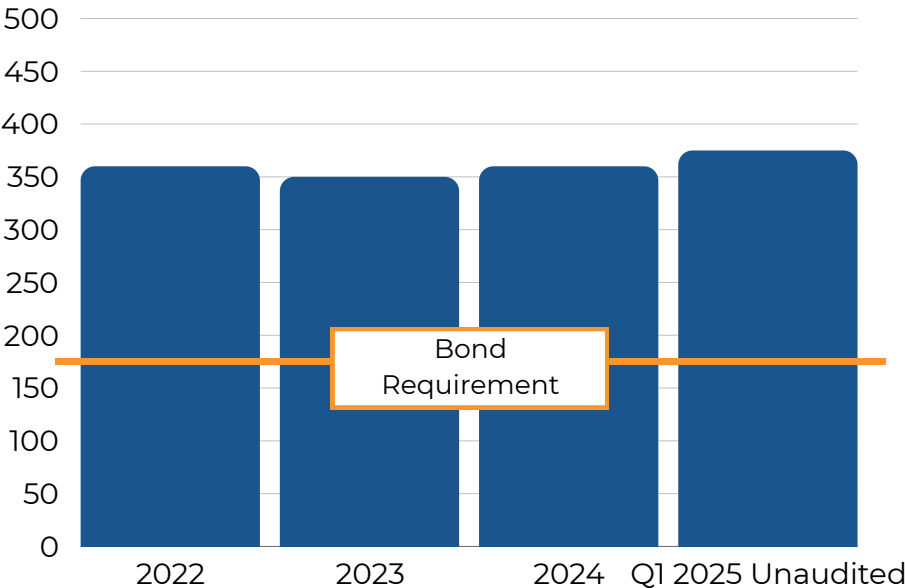

Long-Term Financial Stability

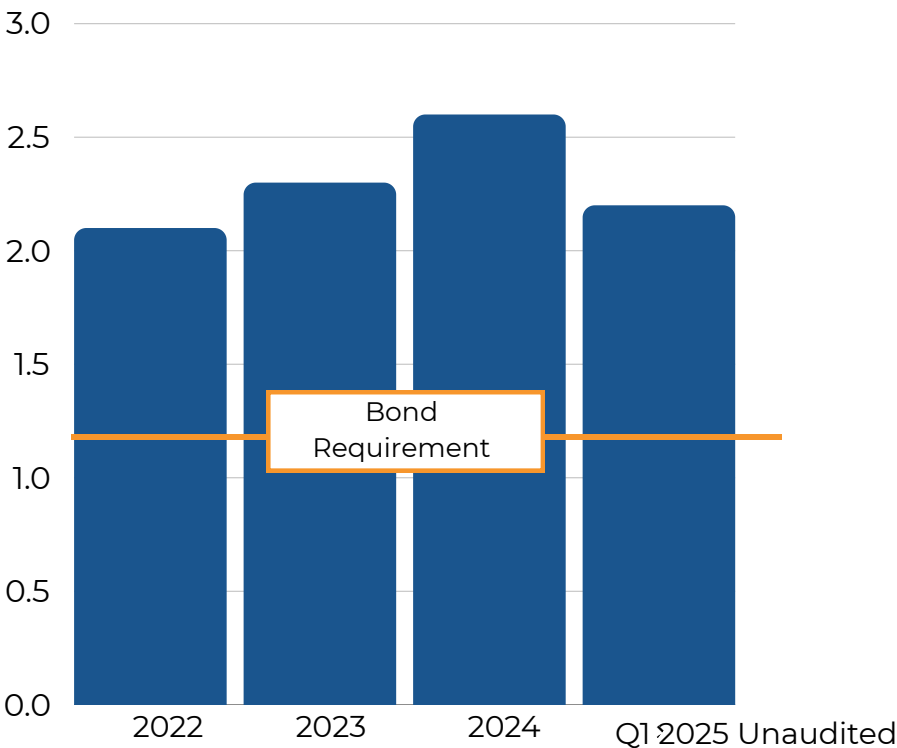
Days Cash on Hand

In recent years, Plymouth Place has made a significant investment in The Landing with an average annual capital spending of \$3.8 million.

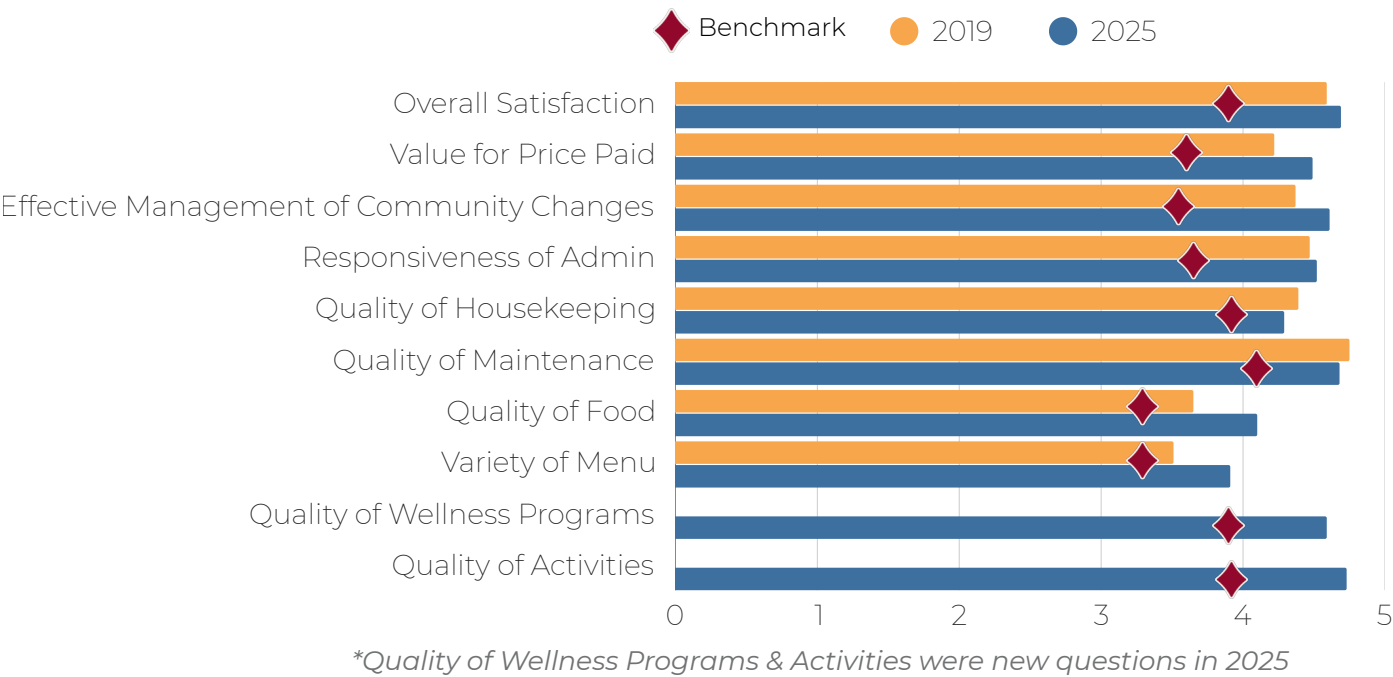

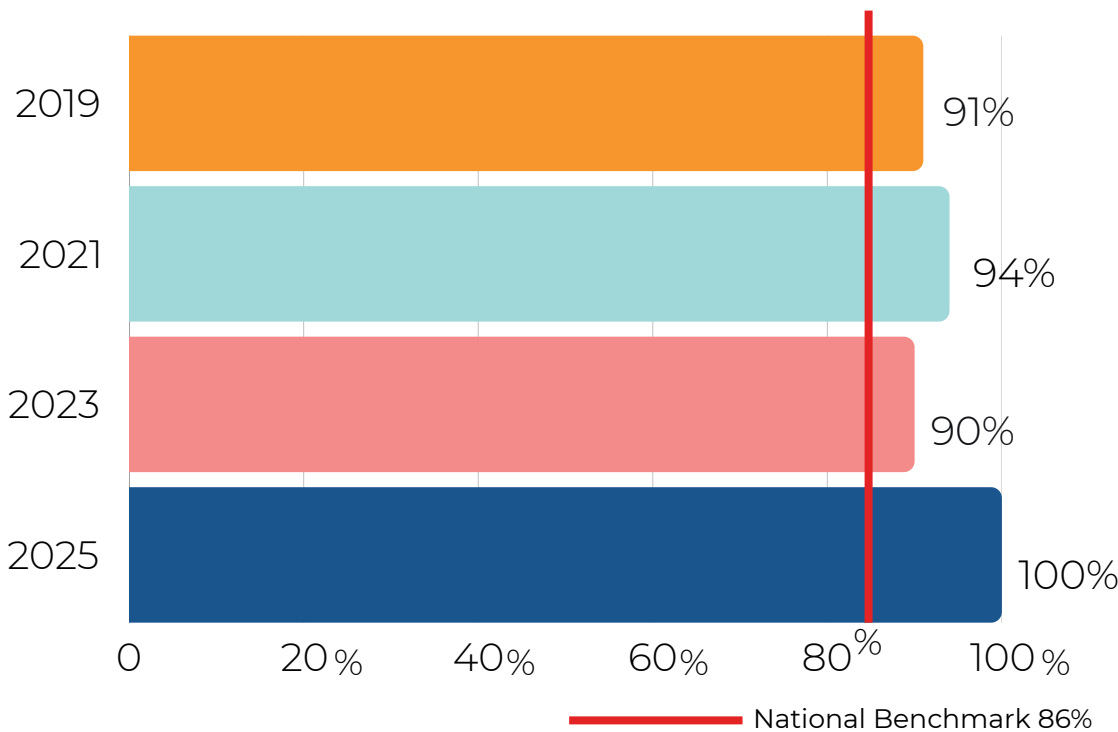

At Plymouth Place, national and regional recognition from leaders in architecture, wellness, and senior living reflects more than beautiful design. It honors a mission-driven, collaborative process.

Grounded in strategic planning, resident input, and a thoughtfully phased master plan, our work emphasizes engagement at every level. This approach has earned awards from the Environments for Aging (EFA) Design Showcase, where juries praised our integration of wellness features, spacious residences, rooftop garden, and the scale and density of our villas. Adding LIFE to Years with Our Wellness Continuum

At Plymouth Place, we believe in adding LIFE to years. Our Wellness Continuum focuses on **rejuvenation, growth, and overall well-being through a multi-faceted approach** to active living. Wellness, to us, is both an art and a science, designed to flex with each resident's unique needs and interests.

Our experienced exercise physiologists and fitness specialists create tailored fitness programs, including land, aquatic, and recreational classes. Rock Steady Boxing, a non-contact program for individuals with Parkinson's Disease, enhances motor function and quality of life, inspiring some residents to choose Plymouth Place as their home.

Holistic wellness experiences like dual-task training, sound bowl therapy, meditation, and dance nurture the mind, body, and spirit. Our sports hardening classes prepare residents for golf, ping-pong, pickleball, and bocce, many of which are resident-led and community-driven.

At our clinic, we provide a **concierge approach to care with personalized support** from physicians, nurses, audiologists, podiatrists, and the Care Connect team. Our in-house therapy team offers Physical, Occupational, and Speech Therapy to residents at all care levels. We also use specialized modalities, including non-narcotic pain management and neurological programs like LSVT LOUD and LSVT BIG, to enhance our therapeutic services.

Our foundation is rooted in **health, harmony, and happiness**. We are proud to offer wellness programs that not only keep pace with global trends but are also shaped by the passions and preferences of the Plymouth Place community.

At Plymouth Place, life is meant to be lived fully. Beyond resident-led programs, we offer over 80 life enrichment programs each month—from jewelry-making to theater excursions—bringing passions to life and empowering residents to explore, create, and lead.

Our upgraded venues now provide premier experiences in classical music, jazz, and piano performances, with weekly concerts featuring top artists from across the Midwest. **“We’re not just building performance spaces,”** said Cheri Boubliis, Senior Director of Hospitality. **“We’re creating immersive environments that welcome everyone.”**

“Creativity doesn’t end with age or ability,” said Kathleen Riley, Director of Life Enrichment. **“It evolves, and we make space for that evolution.”**



Inclusive music remains a priority. Resident-led Singing Sages, partnerships with Songs by Heart, and sensory-friendly events ensure access for those with memory, mobility, or hearing challenges. Visual arts programs, hands-on activities like Drum Circle, and the new Artists in Residence initiative support creative expression for all.

Culinary experiences include chef-led themed dinners, wine tastings, and cultural celebrations. In 2024, residents enjoyed a variety of travel opportunities—from local excursions to a memorable trip to Scotland. **“As we travel, we grow in spirit and community,”** CEO/President Jay Biere said. At Plymouth Place, aging well means having the freedom to live vibrantly, pursue passions, and create memories every day.

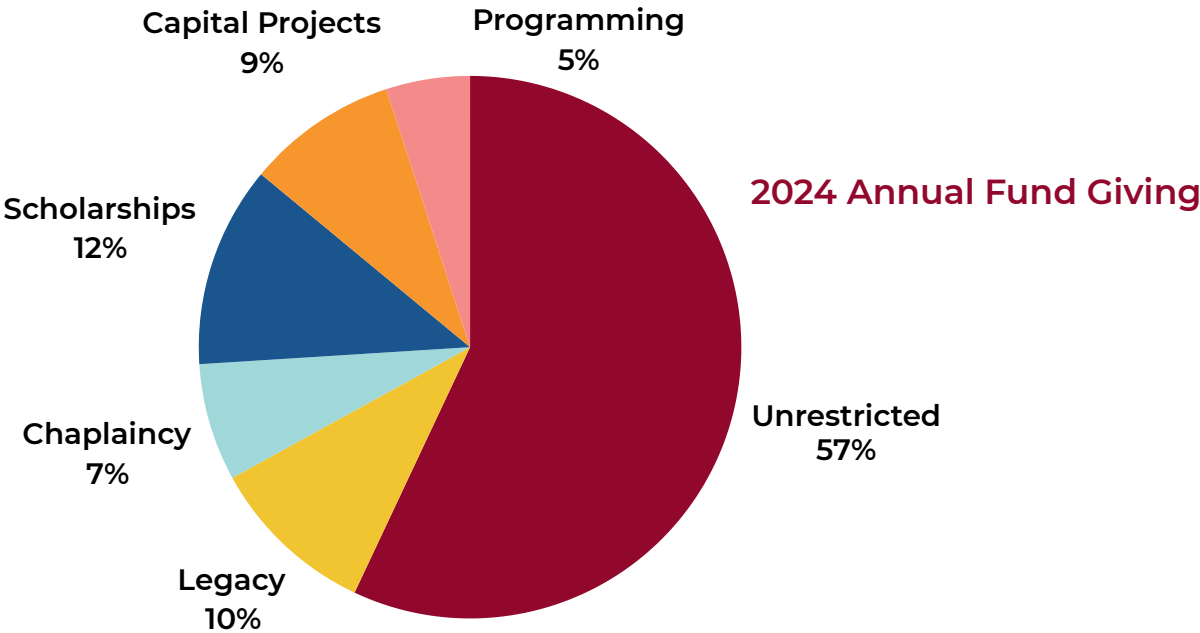
